



A Voyage on the Last of the Great Ocean Liners with **Malcolm Bryant**

The era of the great ocean liner is said to have begun in 1843 when the SS Great Britain designed by Isambard Kingdom Brunel began service between the UK and the US. Over the years bigger and more luxurious liners were built carrying the wealthy across the Atlantic in great style (while carrying large numbers of immigrants in cramped unsanitary conditions below decks). The advent of successful commercial jet liner service across the Atlantic in the late 1950s signaled the gradual decline of the ocean liner. Now there is only one remaining - Cunard's Queen Mary 2, which makes the round trip journey from Southampton UK to New York City once a month. Malcolm will present a brief history of the great ocean liners, and then take you along as he travels from Pier 3 in Brooklyn to Southampton Dock and provide a window into what it is like to make the leisurely 8 day crossing.

Driver education promotes and teaches safe driving attitudes, develops defensive driving skills, and respect for the rules of the road. It prepares students for the RMV license exam and it strives to prevent or reduce accidents and fatalities that involve young drivers.

Driver Education age requirements

- 15 years, 9 months: The minimum age you must be on *the first day* of class per RMV regulations.
- 16 years: You are now eligible to obtain and drive with a Learner's Permit.
- 16 1/2 years: If you have had your permit for 6 months AND completed Driver Education, you are eligible to take your road test.
- 18 years: You are now eligible to take your road test without a Driver Education Certificate

Steps to complete Driver Education:

Parent Class:

There is a \$25 fee If your child is attending another Driver Education program You must attend the RMV-mandated class before your child is allowed to begin driving lessons with an instructor. We will cover your responsibilities, your child's responsibilities, and review our program's policies. Also, you will hear tips and hints on how to teach a new driver and a review of laws that have changed in the last 10-20 years. While we welcome both parents to come and speak with us, only one parent is required to complete the class.

Once you get your permit, send us the permit number and issue date so we can activate your account for you to start scheduling lessons.



You must complete 12 hours of behind-the-wheel lessons and 6 hours of observation, in addition to a minimum of 40 hours of practice at home.

We offer lessons after school, on weekends, and vacations. Depending on your schedule, you may be able to schedule lessons during free blocks. *You must have a full hour available.

Total fee: \$825



Tips for Success

- ☑ We recommend that you complete the program within one year this way everything you're learning is fresh when you go for your road test. The RMV requires you to complete the program within two years from the date you started.
- ☑ Once you get your permit, send us your permit number and the issue date. We will activate your Schedule2Drive account and you can start booking lessons.
- ☑ You must have your permit for a minimum of 6 months so there is no reason to rush through lessons! We recommend spacing out your 12 driving hours with us so you finish about a month before that 6 month eligibility. This allows us time to send your certificate to the RMV, allowing you to schedule your road test once you reach that 6 month date.
- Once all of the requirements are completed, we send a certificate to the RMV (\$15 fee, included in your tuition). About a week later, you can log on to myRMV and book your road test!
- ☑ If you want us to sponsor you for your road test, send us the date, time, and location once it is booked.



Notable Supreme Court Cases of 2023

with Douglas Wilkins

This year, the U.S. Supreme Court addressed affirmative action, voting rights, sexual orientation, religion, free speech, water pollution, student debt and economic regulation. Did the justices honestly try to determine what the constitution, precedent and facts require? Or do their decisions just reflect the majority's policy preferences or partisan behavior? As one justice says, to answer these questions, we must "read the decision." For nine of the court's 2023 decisions, we will do that. Did the court's majority stay within its judicial lane in each case? Did it jump existing guardrails or put its thumb on the scales? Did it respect the Civil War Amendments' equal protection guarantee, including abolishing the incidents of slavery? The instructor will draw on his experience as a recently-retired trial court judge and, previously, a lawyer who briefed and argued cases in state and federal appellate courts, including one U. S. Supreme Court oral argument.



If a class needs to be cancelled due to low enrollment, you will be notified 2 business days prior to the start date and receive a full refund. A \$25 fee for all checks returned due to insufficient funds will be charged and added to your course tuition, in accordance with MGL Ch 60, Sec 57A.

Who Can Enroll?

Anyone can enroll in our programs at the same tuition. Adult classes are open to ages 18+, unless otherwise specified. Younger students are welcome to enroll if a parent/guardian also enrolls.

Refunds & Course Changes

If you withdraw 1 week or more before the start date of a class, we will issue you a credit (good for 18 months from the date of issue). If you prefer, we will refund the class tuition minus a \$10 processing fee. Withdrawals from courses and events under \$25 are only eligible for a course credit. If you withdraw 6 days or less from the start date of a class, we do not issue course credits or refunds.

Virtual Class Information

Many of our classes will be on Zoom. We strongly recommend that you test your device and get comfortable with the platform before the start of your class. **Zoom links are emailed the day before the class.** If you do not see it, check your spam folder and contact the office before 4 pm.

Also, while it may be easy to share a screen when joining a class from home, we do require each participant to be registered separately unless otherwise noted.

Class Materials

Some classes may require you to purchase supplies beforehand which is indicated in the class descriptions. Register early to give yourself time to acquire the materials needed.

If you have an existing credit, you can register online and apply it at checkout or contact us before registering.

Waitlists

If the class you want is full, sign up for the waitlist. There is no charge and we often get last-minute changes or add sections.




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
