

SAT Bootcamp: Reading/Writing

Both Alison and Bee work closely with high school seniors throughout the school year: Alison helps students to refine and narrow their college choices, and Bee helps students to craft and edit their college essays and supplements.

Digital Photography II





Driver Education



Driver education promotes and teaches safe driving attitudes, develops defensive driving skills, and respect for the rules of the road. It prepares students for the RMV license exam and it strives to prevent or reduce accidents and fatalities that involve young drivers.

Driver Education age requirements

- 15 years, 9 months: The minimum age you must be on *the first day* of class per RMV regulations
- 16 years: You are now eligible to obtain a Learner's Permit and drive with an adult
- 16 1/2 years: If you have had your permit for 6 months AND completed Driver Education, you are eligible to take your road test
- 18 years: You are now eligible to take your road test without a Driver Education Certificate

Steps to complete Driver Education:

Parent Class:

\$35 If your child is attending another Driver Education program

You must attend the RMV-mandated class **before** your child is allowed to begin driving lessons with an instructor. We will cover your responsibilities, your child's responsibilities, and review our program's policies. Also, you will hear tips and hints on how to teach a new driver and review laws that have changed in the last 10-20 years. While we welcome both parents to attend, only one parent is required to complete the class.

Once you get your permit, send us a photo of your permit so we can activate your account in our scheduling software. We offer lessons after school, on weekends, and during vacations.



You must complete 12 hours of behind-the-wheel lessons and 6 hours of observation, in addition to a minimum of 40 hours of practice at home.

Walking Tour: 400 Years of West End History Grace Clipson & Sebastian Belfanti

This walking tour of the West End traces a circle around the neighborhood while discussing the people and places of the area over the past 4 centuries. The history of the West End is one of continual change, American firsts, Boston innovations, and modern icons. The West End Museum, and this walking tour, celebrate the story of the neighborhood that led the way in Boston's immigrant era, supporting thousands of the world's "huddled masses" as they found their way from North End slums to the American Dream. By then, the West End had already produced America's first native-born architect, provided a home for free Black citizens after the Revolution, and led the way in the construction of railroads, electric street cars, and so much more. The neighborhood changed dramatically after 1950. Two decades of Urban Renewal led

to the clearing of more than half the neighborhood, and reinvention in its modern form.

We will explore the North End and visit the following sites: Edmund Hartt shipyard, area of the Great Molasses Flood (1919), the Prince Street location of the Draft Riot (1863), and the location of the infamous Brink's Robbery (1950). Next, we will make our way across the North Washington Street bridge and into Charlestown. Once in the Navy Yard, we will discuss the founding of the Yard as one of the original six Navy yards in the US. The tour will end at the USS Constitution Museum at approximately 12:15 PM.

Electricity and Magnetism Steve Reznek

Not knowing what electricity and magnetism (E/M) are has not stopped us from learning how to use them. The course traces that learning. The paradox has been called the "Action at a Distance Dilemma". How can one object affect another when separated from it? The people who have tried to resolve this have been called many things - gods, priests, magicians and physicists. The ancient ideas were Devine mysteries. The course next treats the 1700's experiments. They explored electrical effects and proposed both the correct and incorrect explanations of their causes. By the 1800's the modern interpretation began to emerge. Newton's idea of a field laid the ground work. The central ideas were the electric and magnetic fields with charges and currents as their sources. The final concept was the description of the way a change in a source or a field would charge the other fields. The great realization was that in order to build a motor, a television or a computer: YOU DON'T NEED TO KNOW WHAT E/M ARE. ALL YOU NEED TO KNOW IS HOW CHANGING ONE THING AFFECTS THE OTHERS. Although the E/M interactions are expressed in mathematics, the course does not include math nor require a math background.

More Notable Supreme Court Cases of 2024 and 2025 **Doug Wilkins**

Last year's extraordinary U.S. Supreme Court term wasn't just about gun regulation, abortion, President Trump and agency power (all of which we discussed in the fall). The Court also addressed free speech, cutting edge social media issues and voting rights, among other things. Already this year, it has decided the Tik Tok case, including free speech. We will read and discuss summaries of four or five 2024 cases that are significant in themselves or that hint at the justices' likely direction on important guestions in the near future. While this course will start where our Fall discussion ended, it is self-contained and does not assume that you took any prior course. We will analyze one case per week and ask:

- Did the justices honestly try to determine what the constitution, precedent and facts require?
- Or do their decisions just reflect the majority's policy preferences or partisan behavior?
- Which judges provided "swing votes" and why?

As one justice says, to answer these questions, we must "read the decision." Doug will draw on his experience as a recently-retired trial court judge and, previously, a lawyer who briefed and argued cases in state and federal appellate courts, including one U.S. Supreme Court oral argument. 

Registration

Classes are filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Payment in full is due at the time of registration to secure your space. Once you enroll, you will receive a confirmation by email. If you do not see the email, check your spam or promotions folders. Please register early!

If a class needs to be cancelled due to low enrollment, you will be notified 2 business days prior to the start date and receive a full refund. A \$25 fee for all checks returned due to insufficient funds will be charged and added to your course tuition.

Who Can Enroll?

Anyone can enroll in our programs at the same tuition. Adult classes are open to ages 18+, unless otherwise specified. Younger students are welcome to enroll if a parent/guardian also enrolls.

Refunds & Course Changes

If you withdraw 1 week or more before the start date of a class, we will issue you a credit (good for 18 months from the date of issue). If you prefer, we will refund the class tuition minus a \$10 processing fee. Withdrawals from courses and events under \$25 are only eligible for a course credit. If you withdraw 6 days or less from the start date of a class, we do not issue course credits or refunds.

Virtual Class Information
